ORDINANCE 2022-07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, GEORGIA AMENDING THE OFFICIAL ZONING DISTRICT MAP OF THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, AS AMENDED, BY REZONING PROPERTY KNOWN AS COWETA COUNTY TAX PARCEL NUMBER G06 0002 008 US HIGHWAY 29 FROM R-20 (SINGLE FAMILY RESIDENTIAL) TO GC (GENERAL COMMERCIAL) ZONING DISTRICT; TO IMPOSE CONDITIONS UPON THE PROPERTY; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES

WHEREAS, an application to rezone certain property was filed with the City of Grantville by James O. Sells; and

WHEREAS, said rezoning application was reviewed by the Planning Commission and a public hearing was held following public notice and all other requirements of the City of Grantville's Zoning Ordinance;

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia, and by the authority of same, as follows:

Section 1.

The Official Zoning District Map for the City of Grantville, as amended, is hereby further amended so as to rezone the .73-acre property, more particularly described in the overall legal description attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and depicted as parcel number G06 0002 008 on the survey attached hereto as Exhibit "B" from the R-20 (Single Family Residential) Zoning District to the GC (General Commercial) Zoning District.

Section 2.

The zoning amendment authorized in Section 1 is approved subject to all conditions, including any conditions of zoning attached hereto as Exhibit "C", which exhibit is hereby incorporated by this reference and applies to the .73-acre property. All permits issued pursuant to this change in zoning shall be in strict compliance with these conditions, as well as all other applicable provisions of the ordinances of the City of Grantville. The change in zoning hereby approved does not authorize the violation of any zoning district regulations.

Section 3.

The Official Zoning District Map of the City of Grantville, established as a part of the City of Grantville Zoning Ordinance, as amended, is hereby further amended to reflect the change in zoning of said property authorized in Section 1.

The City of Grantville's annual budget will be submitted to the Mayor and City Council on Monday, July 25, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. at the Glanton Municipal Complex, 123 Lagrange Street, Grantville, Georgia.

The Grantville Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget and full written text of the proposed Budget Ordinance are available for review in the City Clerk's office at City Hall during regular business hours.

Public Hearings on the proposed Grantville Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget and proposed millage rate will take place on Tuesday, August 2, 2022 at 9:00 a.m.; Monday, August 8, 2022 at 6:30 p.m.; and Monday, August 22, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. or thereafter at the Glanton Municipal Complex, 123 Lagrange Street, Grantville, Georgia.

The proposed Budget Ordinance will provide a statement of the amount budgeted for anticipated revenues by source and the amount budgeted for expenditures. The Budget Ordinance will be considered for adoption at the regularly scheduled meeting of the Mayor and City Council on Monday, August 22, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. at the Glanton Municipal Complex, 123 Lagrange Street, Grantville, Georgia.

NOTICE OF PROPERTY TAX INCREASE

The City of Grantville has tentatively adopted a millage rate which will require an increase in property taxes by 5.86%. All concerned citizens are invited to the public hearings on this tax increase to be held at the Glanton Municipal Complex, on Tuesday, August 2, 2022 at 9:00 a.m. and on Monday, August 8, 2022 at 6:30 p.m.

Time and place of an additional public hearing on this tax increase is at the Glanton Municipal Complex on Monday, August 22, 2022 at 6:30 p.m.

The tentative increase will result in a millage rate of 4.750 mills, an increase of .263 mills above the roll-back rate (4.487 mills). A millage rate of 4.750 mills restores the City to its financial position in 2021, partially compensates for the increased cost of materials, supplies and labor while providing employee benefits that have been advocated by Council Members without impacting the General Fund. Without this tentative tax increase, the millage rate will be no more than 4.487 mills. The proposed tax increase for a home with a fair market value of \$150,000 (with a \$10,000 homestead exemption) is approximately \$1.10 per month or \$13.20 annually. The proposed tax increase for nonhomestead property with a fair market value of \$150,000 is approximately \$1.32 per month or \$15.84 annually.

In response to the Request for Proposals, we received proposals from contractors at City Hall at 2:00 P.M., local time, on July 7, 2022, for the referenced project. A total of five (5) proposals were received as outlined in the summary below.

A certified tabulation of all proposals received is attached. A copy of the tabulation has been sent to each contractor for their information.

All proposals received were evaluated and scored per the RFP documents. Based on this evaluation the proposal submitted by Onyx Blasting & Coating, LLC, received the highest score for the proposals.

In addition, we investigated the qualifications of Onyx Blasting & Coating, LLC, and have determined that the contractor is professionally qualified to perform the work.

Based on a check of the references provided by the low bidder, Onyx Blasting & Coating, LLC, has successfully completed numerous projects, which are similar in scope to this project. In addition, Onyx Blasting & Coating, LLC, has sufficient equipment and finances to accomplish work associated with this project.

Therefore, Brennan Jones Engineering Associates, LLC, recommends the City of Grantville award the construction contract to Onyx Blasting & Coating, LLC, in the amount of \$227,375.00 for the Grantville Water Tank Rehabilitation project, contingent on adequate funding being available from the SPLOST Fund and/or other sources to finance the work.

In addition, due to the extensive nature of the water tank rehabilitation work, we recommend that the city engage inspection services to be performed by a NACE Level III certified inspector to ensure that the surface preparation and coatings are properly prepared and installed. A budget of \$30,000.00 should be established for the inspection services. We have obtained a proposal from a NACE Level III qualified inspector, Mr. Steve Williams of Protective Coatings Sales, Inc., for the required inspection services. We recommend that the City execute a contract with Protective Coatings Sales, Inc. for inspection services.

On July 15, 2022, the Grantville Historic Preservation Commission (the "Commission") issued a decision denying an application for certificate of appropriateness (the "Decision") submitted by Capital City Bank ("CCB"). Please accept this correspondence as CCB's appeal of the Decision pursuant to Section 20-6(p) of the Grantville City Code.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION

On July 22, 2015, the Georgia Department of Natural Resources, Environmental Protection Division (the "Department"), approved CCB's application to participate in Georgia's Voluntary Remediation Program ("VRP") involving Mill #2 (the "VRP Application"). Notably, the VRP Application, which was submitted in lieu of a Corrective Action Plan Addendum and Compliance Status Report required pursuant to the Georgia Hazardous Site Response Act, proposed the following corrective action:

- 1. Monitored Natural Attenuation, In-Situ Chemical Oxidation, and/or Enhanced In-Situ Bioremediation to address groundwater contamination.
- 2. Further investigation of soil to determine if action is needed.

During the course of the environmental restoration project, it was found that the soil underneath Mill #2 was contaminated. In order to comply with the requirements of the VRP and address safety concerns involving the roof structure of Mill #2, an application for certificate of appropriateness was submitted to the Commission, on or about October 29, 2019 (the "Original")

Application").³ The Original Application proposed a *complete demolition* of Mill #2. As described in the Original Application, a structural engineer performed an inspection of Mill #2 and issued an opinion indicating that the roof structure is unstable and unsafe.⁴ Consequently, the Commission approved the Original Application on November 24, 2019 (the "Approval").⁵

On or about June 21, 2022, an application for certificate of appropriateness was submitted to the Commission, which modified the demolition plan of Mill #2 (the "Modified Application"). In an effort to retain the integrity of the historic district and preserve the structure of Mill #2 for future redevelopment, the Modified Application revised the plan to strictly limit the demolition to the damaged section of the roof. Additionally, the Modified Application calls for the removal of approximately twenty (20) feet of the brick wall on the backside of the building. The purpose of removing this section of the wall is to allow equipment access to safely remove the roof structure and complete the environmental restoration.

BASIS FOR APPEAL

The Decision involves the Modified Application and imposes several onerous conditions not previously required under the Approval. In particular, the Decision states, "[n]o wall should be cut or otherwise removed." The Commission maintains that "all of the brick walls surrounding the contamination site would most likely collapse if the back wall is removed." However, this assertion is provided without any reliable facts, data, or methodology in support and is not backed by basic engineering principles.

The Modified Application proposes the removal of approximately twenty (20) feet, which is less than ten (10%) of the length of the wall on the backside of Mill #2. Furthermore, the Approval actually permitted the demolition of Mill #2 in its entirety. Considering one of the main purposes of the Commission is the protection, preservation and rehabilitation of historic properties, the logic of the denial of the Modified Application is unknown. CCB was prepared to completely demolish Mill #2. To now hinder CCB when it is attempting to retain the integrity of the historic district defies the overall purpose of the Commission.

Moreover, the Decision states "[t]he commission feels the crane can hoist the roof out of the enclosure by going over the front wall rather than removing the back wall." This proposed method is practically impossible to perform without (1) further damage to the structure of Mill #2, (2) serious exposure of injury to the individuals performing the scope of work, and (3) violating the OSH Act of 1970 and the rules, regulations, and standards promulgated by the Occupational Safety and Health Administration.

Given same, it appears the Commission has disregarded its statement "safety must take precedence" mentioned in the Approval. Selma Coty, Chairperson of the Commission, was quoted

in an article, on November 26, 2019,⁷ stating "I really didn't think we had a choice but to allow the building to be demolished and we would have to act accordingly because of safety reasons." Chairperson Coty further stated that six (6) people came before the Commission and "[t]hose people were long-time residents of the Mill Village and lived right next door to it and it has been a problem for them and they were anxious to have this issue resolved."

Not only has the Commission overlooked its previous position regarding safety, it has also failed to consider the economic harm created by requiring CCB to "[r]eplace the roof when contamination is remediated." First, it is unclear whether the Commission is requiring a full or partial roof replacement. Regardless, it is premature and an unnecessary expense at this juncture. The future redevelopment of Mill #2 is not close to being finalized and the architectural design and structural components of the roof will likely depend on Mill #2's redevelopment. Furthermore, requiring a roof replacement when the Commission previously approved the complete demolition of the same building is difficult to reconcile.

Another serious concern is the likelihood of further delays on the project caused by the Decision. The Modified Application permits equipment access into the building, which will be utilized in performing the demolition of the roof structure *and* environmental restoration work (e.g., soil remediation). The Decision restricts CCB's ability to remove a portion of the brick wall. This impedes the capability to operate equipment inside the building and, thus, slows down the project. Additionally, CCB will have to revise the plans, specifications, and conditions associated with the scope of work, requiring CCB to solicit new bids.

Respectfully, it is our view that the Commission did not prioritize safety, historical preservation, or the community's needs when issuing the Decision. Section 20-6(k) of the Grantville City Code provides that the Commission may interpret its provisions in such a way that would ordinarily be prohibited to avoid undue hardships so long as such variances remain in harmony with the purpose of said provisions. Mill #2 poses a health and safety risk, but if the Modified Application is approved, the building can be safely preserved for future use and allow CCB to address the environmental concerns at the property. Notwithstanding these challenges, CCB respects the historical nature of Mill #2 and is committed to working with the city and preserving the integrity of the historic district.

RELIEF REQUESTED

Based on the foregoing, CCB requests the City Council of Grantville, Georgia, reject the Decision and approve the Modified Application. CCB reserves the right to supplement and amend its appeal.

The Grantville Historic Preservation Commission met on Tuesday evening, July 12th, to discuss and make a decision regarding your COA Application for a modified demolition plan for Mill #2 (#2022-04).

After a lengthy discussion, the commission regrets to inform you that it cannot approve your plan, as presented, because of concerns that all of the brick walls surrounding the contamination site would most likely collapse if the back wall is removed. We did, however, approve your proposal with the following conditions:

- 1. The commission recommends that the equipment used to remove the roof work from the exterior of the building. The commission feels the crane can hoist the roof out of the enclosure by going over the front wall rather than removing the back wall.
- 2. Retain all of the walls, even if supports are required.
- 3. Replace the roof when contamination is remediated.
- 4. No wall should be cut or otherwise removed.

The goal of the Grantville Preservation Commission is to retain the integrity of the historic district. The mill is a big part of that history, which is why it is included in our local historic district and our National Register District. This mill dates back to 1886-1887 and is written about on the West Georgia Textile Trail website. The commission would like to see this building preserved and repurposed.

We look forward to seeing this project completed, as we have suggested. According to our local ordinance, you have six months to begin this project and 18 months to complete it. You may renew your COA application if the project is not completed within the specified time frame.

EPD requires that Capital City Bank and the professional engineer/geologist specified in the VIRP oversee the implementation of the VIRP in accordance with the provisions, purposes, standards, and policies of the Act. EPD may, at its sole discretion, review and comment on documents submitted by Capital City Bank. However, failure of EPD to respond to a submittal within any timeframe does not relieve Capital City Bank from complying with the specified schedule and the provisions, purposes, standards and policies of the Act. Should Capital City Bank fail to comply with the above schedule, EPD may terminate enrollment of the participant and the qualifying property from the voluntary remediation program.

EPD anticipates receipt of the first semi-annual progress report by January 22, 2016 and a compliance status report, including certification, on or before July 22, 2020. The proposed scope of work is the demolition of the building identified as "Mill #2" at the former Grantville Mill located at 41 Industrial Way, Grantville, Georgia. Attachment A identifies the building designated as Mill#2 and the limits of the proposed demolition are detailed in Attachment B.

While performing environmental restoration at the site in August 2019, roofing support poles detached or were found to be unfastened due to the general deterioration of the structure. As a result, the roof of Mill#2 is sagging with structural timbers separating at several locations causing a safety concern and therefore a work stoppage with respect to the environmental restoration.

The building was evaluated by a structural engineer on September 4, 2019 to determine if the building could be stabilized. The engineer's opinion was "the roof structure could collapse at any moment and without warning" (see attached report). Furthermore, it was recommended no personnel be allowed under the roof and the roof be demolished for safety. Therefore, the site owner, Capital City Bank, is requesting a permit to demolish the affected building.

Following demolition of the building and any additional environmental restoration work (e.g., soil remediation) the footprint of the demolished building will be regraded and reseeded (Attachment C). New galvanized steel mesh fencing will be erected at the former Mill#2 building boundary to prevent trespassers from accessing the site and where Mill#2 contacts Mill#1, any openings will be sealed with exterior-grade wood panels (Attachments D).

Dear Mr. Garrett:

Heath and Lineback Engineers (H&L) visited the structure located at 41 Industrial Way Grantville, GA. The structure consists of a roof that spans between masonry walls, supported by heavy timber beams that span between masonry columns at the roof edge and intermediate steel columns along the roof span.

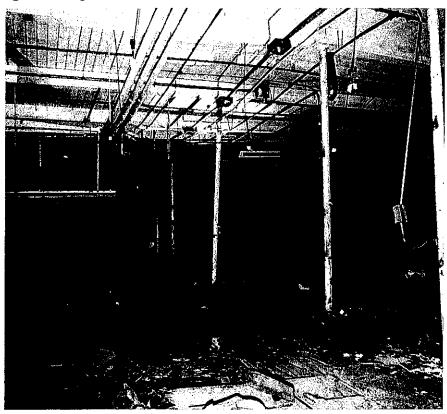


Figure 1 - Roof Structure

This inspection was requested because some of the intermediate steel columns have been damaged and/or removed during construction activities. The goals of this inspection were to assess the stability of the damaged area of roof structure and evaluate solutions to return the structure to a safe, stable condition to allow construction activities to continue. Our inspection was limited to the single area of the most severe roof damage near the Northwest end of the building.

Through this inspection it was determined that in the location under consideration the roof structure is unstable and unsafe due to the damaged and missing intermediate steel columns.

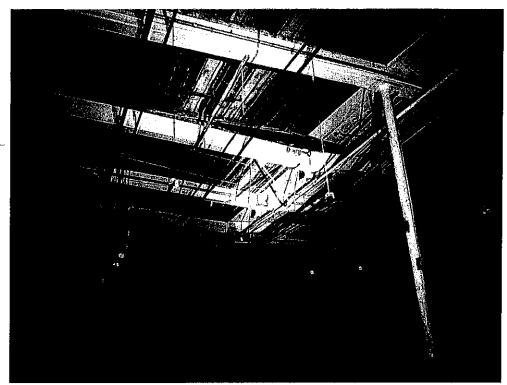


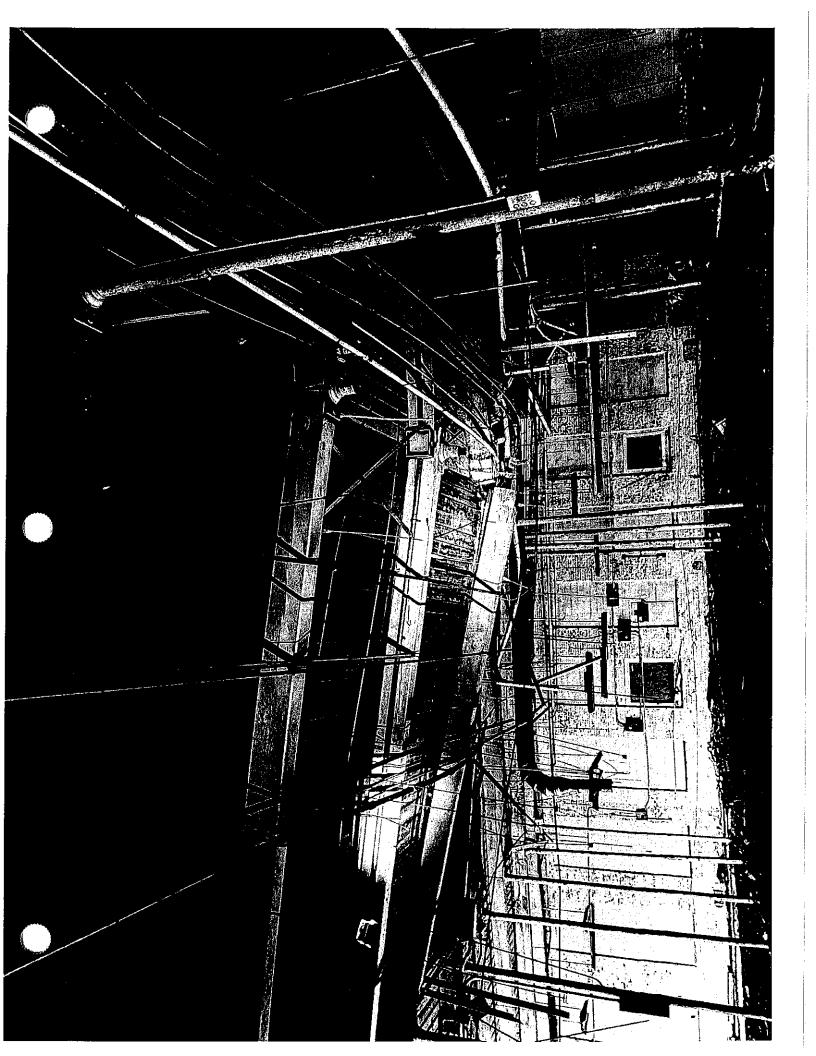
Figure 2 - Damaged Section with Missing Columns

It is our opinion that the roof structure could collapse at any moment and without warning. Due to the unstable nature of the roof, we do not recommend allowing personnel under the damaged roof section to attempt to shore it up. We recommend the damaged portion of the roof be demolished by a method that will not put personnel under the damaged roof section. The area should be immediately secured to prohibit entry by all until the roof is demolished. If the remainder of the structure is to be salvaged, it should be fully inspected by a structural engineer after the damaged section is removed. We will be glad to provide this service, if requested.

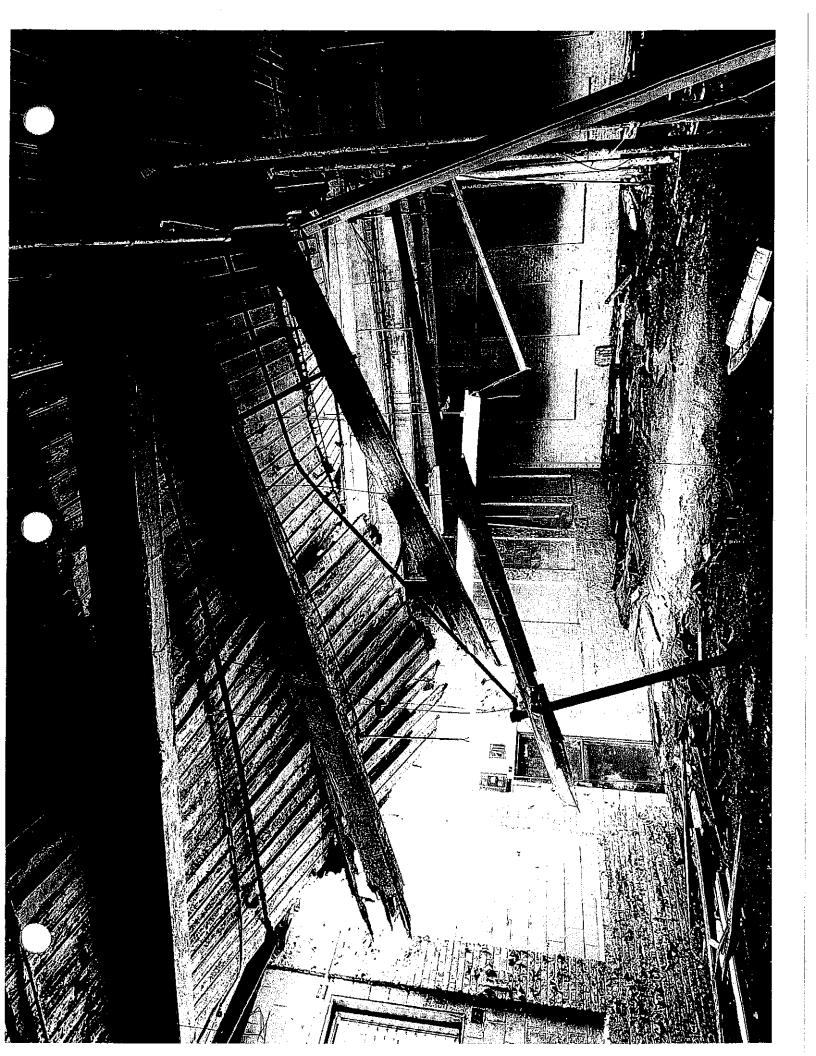

This is to inform you of the Grantville Historic Preservation Commission's decision regarding your COA application #2019-09 dated 10-29-19.

The Grantville Historic Preservation Commission held a Public Hearing, followed by a Special Meeting, on Wednesday, November 20, 2019, to consider your COA application. Mr. Sterling Bryant, with Capital City Bank, made a compelling presentation regarding issues related to the safety of the structure and associated environmental concerns.

Although the structure would have met at least one of the requirements for not approving your application, the commission felt that safety was an overriding reason to approve. Therefore, your application was approved with the following

condition: the proposed fence should provide sufficient security so as to prevent any unauthorized access into the property.

The commission regrets this loss to our historic village, but safety must take precedence. We sincerely hope the remaining building can be repurposed, thus keeping at least a portion of the mill as a contributing factor to the history of the Grantville Mill Village.

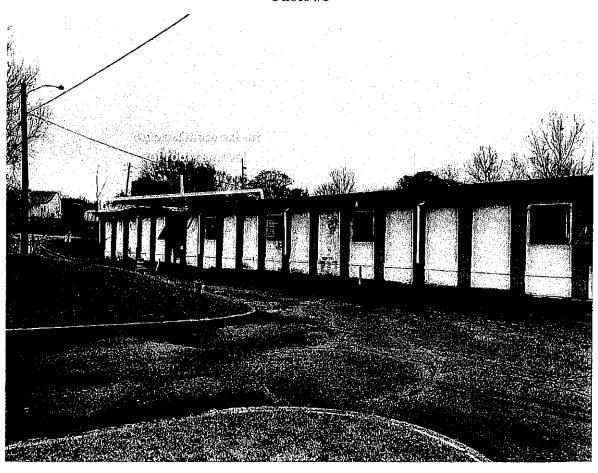
The proposed scope of work at the Grantville Mill site is the partial removal (demolition) of the roof structure for the building identified as "Mill #2" (see Figure 1). While performing environmental restoration at the site in August 2019, roof support poles detached or were found to be unfastened due to the historical construction methods and the general deterioration of the structure. As a result, the roof of Mill#2 is sagging with structural timbers separating at several locations causing a safety concern and therefore a work stoppage with respect to the environmental restoration.

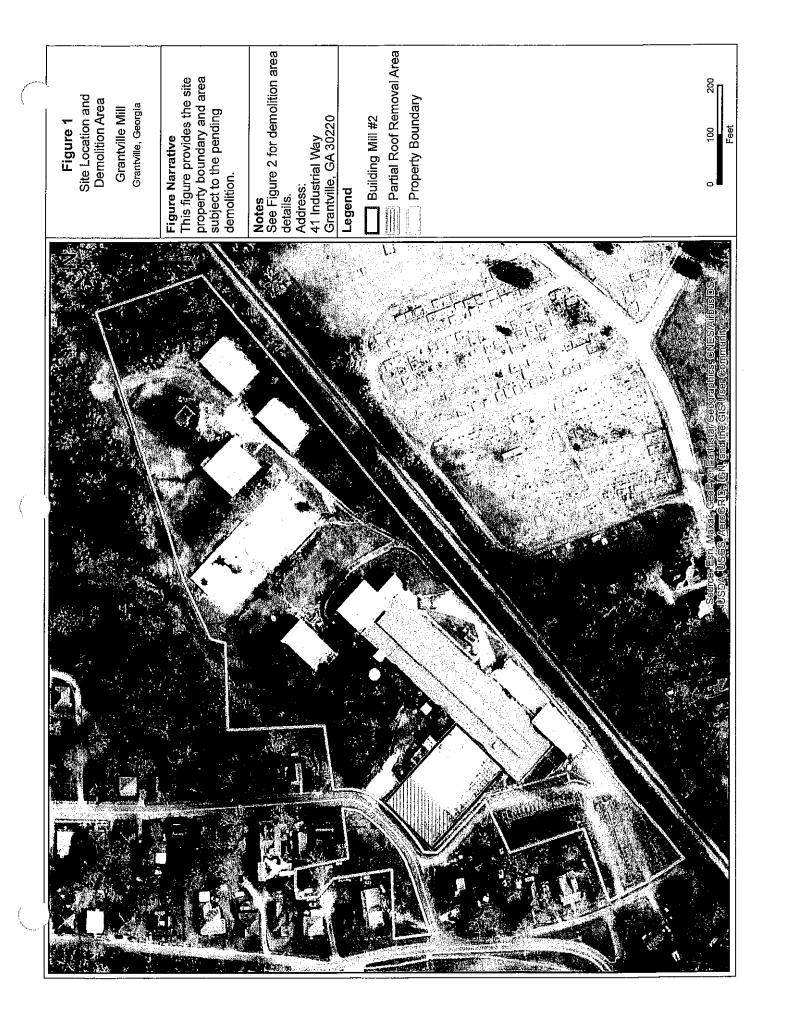
In 2019, Capital City Bank planned to raze the entire building but has since revised the plan to limit the demolition to the damaged section of the roof and to preserve the structure for future redevelopment. The goal is to preserve the brick structure while only removing the portion of the roof that will interfere with the pending environmental work. The limits of the proposed demolition are detailed in Figure 2. In addition to the roof work, a section of brick wall (approximately 20 feet) on the back side of the building (near a former loading dock) will be removed to allow equipment access to safely remove the roof structure and complete the environmental restoration. The wall opening will be closed with a constructed security gate.

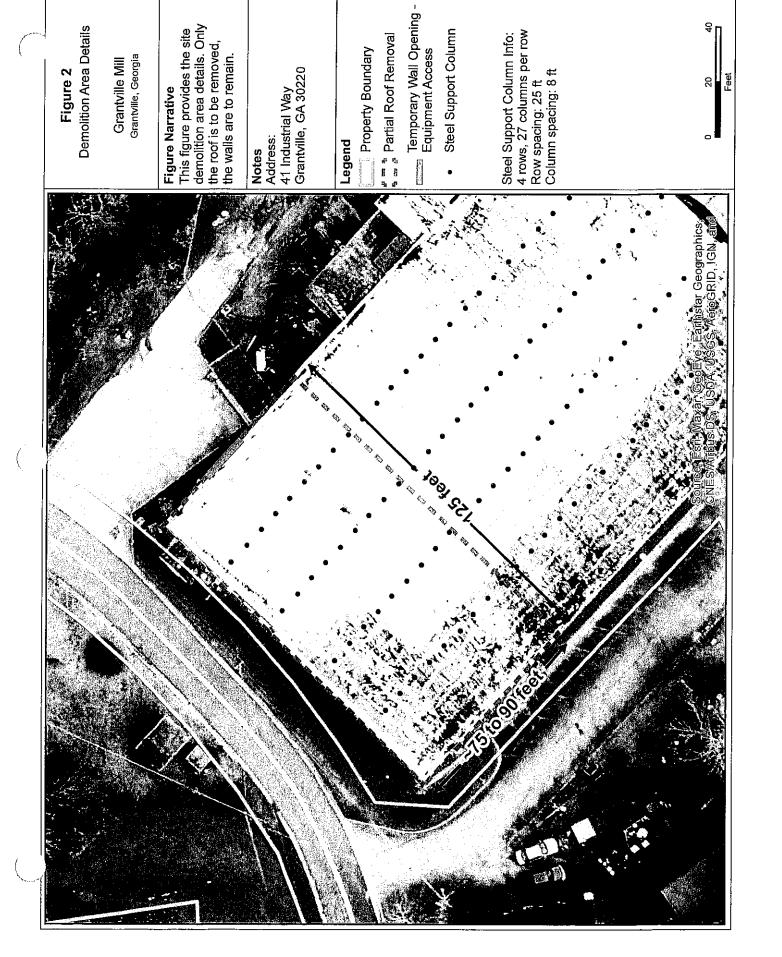
Following the demolition of the roof structure, the environmental restoration work (e.g., soil remediation) will commence to support returning the site to beneficial reuse.

ORDINANCE NO. 2020-02

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE BY THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, GEORGIA PURSUANT TO SECTION 2.11(C) OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, GEORGIA TO PROVIDE FOR THE OPERATION OF THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, GEORGIA DURING THE PUBLIC EMERGENCY OF THE NOVEL CORONAVIRUS DISEASE 2019 GLOBAL PANDEMIC; TO REPEAL CONFLICTING ORDINANCES; TO PROVIDE FOR SEVERABLITY; TO PROVIDE FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE; AND FOR ALL OTHER LAWFUL PURPOSES

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia are charged with the protection of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the City of Grantville, Georgia; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 2.11(C) of the Charter of the City of Grantville the Mayor and City Council of the City of Grantville are empowered to adopt an emergency ordinance to meet a public health emergency affecting life, health, property, safety or public welfare; and

WHEREAS, the spread of the COVID-19 virus has been declared a global pandemic by the World Health Organization ("WHO"); and

WHEREAS, the President of the United States has declared the spread of COVID-19 a nation emergency; and

WHEREAS, the Governor of Georgia has declared the spread of COVID-19 a public health emergency in the state.

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia, and it is hereby ordained by the authority of the same that an emergency ordinance is hereby enacted as follows:

SECTION ONE

The Mayor and City Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia, hereby declare that an emergency affecting life, health, property, safety or public welfare exists within the City of Grantville, Georgia ("City") due to the novel coronavirus disease 2019 ("COVID-19") global pandemic.

SECTION TWO

The following provisions shall govern the operation of the City during the COVID-19 pandemic:

- 1) All City parks, playgrounds and restrooms are hereby closed to the public during the effective time of this ordinance;
- 2) A moratorium on the acceptance of applications and/or permits for events consisting of a gathering of more than the number of people recommended in the Centers for Disease Control's interim guidance for mass gatherings or large community events, as may be amended, is hereby imposed during the effective time of this ordinance;
- 3) Voluntary Shelter in Place: A voluntary shelter in place policy is hereby implemented requesting that individuals not loiter, wander, stroll, or play in any public place within the corporate limits of the City,

Provided, however, that the provisions of this paragraph shall not apply in the following instances:

- a. When a person is upon an emergency errand;
- b. When a person is traveling to, or returning directly home from, lawful employment or otherwise engaged in lawful employment that makes it necessary to be in above referenced places during the proscribed period of time;
- c. When a person is attending or traveling directly to or from an activity involving the exercise of First Amendment rights of free speech, freedom of assembly, or free exercise of religion;
- d. When a person is engaged in interstate and intrastate vehicular travel through the City;
- e. When a person is walking or running to or from their residence for recreational or fitness purposes; and
- f. When a person is procuring food or medicine or seeking medical care.
- 4) Voluntary Prohibition on Gatherings: A voluntary prohibition on gatherings is hereby implemented requesting that there be no public and private assemblages, events, and gatherings of more than ten (10) people within the corporate limits of the City. The voluntary prohibition shall not apply to the following:
 - a. employers and employees gathered at their place of work;
 - b. grocery stores, convenience stores, gas stations, hardware stores, department stores, building supply stores and the like;
 - c. doctors' offices and other health care facilities; or

- d. any "Essential Critical Infrastructure Workforce" as defined by the United States Department of Homeland Security.
- 5) All City utility late fees for the current utility bill received in March are waived and disconnections are stayed until April 15, 2020.
- 6) The operation of essential services, including but not limited to those related to public safety and health shall continue during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- All public hearings or meetings of the City Council or city affiliated boards, committees or commissions are hereby stayed, tolled, and postponed until this ordinance, or any re-enaction hereof, is repealed or expires;
- 8) All votes of the City Council of the City Council permitted or allowed under the Charter or the Code of the City may be conducted in abstentia by conducting meetings by teleconference in accordance with O.C.G.A § 50-14-1(g).
- 9) No city facilities shall be rented for use by the public.

SECTION THREE

The Mayor and Council further recommend that all individuals adhere to recommendation by State and Federal officials and agencies related to health and safety during this pandemic.

SECTION FOUR

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION FIVE

If any section, clause, sentence or phrase of this ordinance is held to be invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, then said holding shall in no way effect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

SECTION SIX

This Ordinance shall become effective immediately upon adoption, and shall remain in effect until it is extended, rescinded, superseded, or amended in writing by action of the Mayor and City Council.

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that any increase or decrease in appropriations or revenues other than those exceptions provided for herein shall require approval of the Mayor and City Council; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that such revisions to the Budget may be made by majority vote of the Mayor and City Council at any business meeting; and

ORDINANCE NO. 2022-06 BEFORE THE CITY COUNCIL

AN ORDINANCE TO ADOPT THE FISCAL YEAR 2022-2023
BUDGET FOR THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, GEORGIA,
APPROPRIATING THE AMOUNTS SHOWN AS EXPENDITURES,
ADOPTING THE ANTICIPATED REVENUES, AND PROHIBITING
EXPENDITURES TO EXCEED APPROPRIATIONS.

WHEREAS, a proposed Budget for the City of Grantville has been presented to the City Council by the Mayor; and

WHEREAS, appropriately advertised public hearings have been held on the proposed Budget, as required by State law and City Charter; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council have reviewed the Budget and have made certain amendments to both funding sources and appropriations, and

WHEREAS, there is a balanced Budget, such that anticipated funding sources equal or exceed proposed expenditures; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council intend to adopt an annual Operating Budget for the Fiscal Year 2022-2023.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED that the Operating Budget, shown as "Exhibit A" attached hereto and by this reference made a part of this Ordinance, shall be the City of Grantville's Fiscal Year 2022-2023 Operating Budget; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this Budget be and is hereby approved and that the anticipated revenues presented for each fund are adopted in the amounts shown and that the amounts shown for each fund as proposed expenditures are hereby appropriated to the departments named in each fund; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that such revisions to the Budget may be made by majority vote of the Mayor and City Council at any business meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that the expenditures shall not exceed the appropriations authorized by the Budget or amendments thereto and that expenditures for the fiscal year shall not exceed actual funding available.
