ORDINANCE TO AMEND SECTION 3.01 OF THE CHARTER OF THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, GEORGIA

WHEREAS, in accordance with the home rule power of O.C.G.A. § 36-35-3, the Mayor and the City Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia, finds that it is in the best interest of the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens to amend the Charter of the City of Grantville by amending Section 3.01;

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia as follows:

Section 1. That the Charter of the City of Grantville is hereby amended by striking Section 3.01 in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

Sec. 3.01. Departments.

The city government shall be organized into the following departments:

Police Department

Utility Department

Administrative Department

Street and Public Works Department

Parks and Recreation Department

The utility department will be composed of the gas system, water system, sanitary sewer system and electrical system.

Unless and until otherwise provided by ordinance, the mayor shall, on the second Monday in January of each year, appoint a committee composed of the councilmembers duly qualified and elected to oversee the functions of the various departments.

Section 2. Should any phrase, clause, sentence or section of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not effect the remaining provisions of this ordinance, which provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

AN ORDINANCE BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL FOR THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE TO AMEND CHAPTER 2- ADMINISTRATION, ARTICLE XIBEAUTIFICATION BOARD, SECTION 2-201, MEMBERSHIP OF THE CODE OF ORDINANCES; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council are authorized pursuant to state law to offer and provide parks and open spaces for the residents of the City of Grantville; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council desire to provide a means for citizen input into the City's beautification efforts; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that the membership qualifications for the Beautification Board for the City of Grantville should be expanded,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia and by the authority thereof:

Section 1. That the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grantville is hereby amended by striking Section 2-201. Membership in its entirety and replacing it as follows:

Sec. 2-201. - Membership.

- (a) The board shall be composed of 5 members who shall be appointed by the city council.
- (b) Members of the board shall be appointed and serve as follows: The city council shall appoint 5 members to serve for a term of two years, or until their successors shall be appointed. All members shall be either a resident, property owner or business owner within the city limits of the City of Grantville, or a resident of Coweta County.
- (c) Vacancies on the board shall be filled by appointment in the same manner and upon the same conditions provided for initial members. Appointments to fill vacancies shall be for the unexpired term. An appointee shall cease to be a member upon resignation submitted to the city council, upon no longer meeting the membership qualifications set forth in subsection (b) of this section, or upon two-thirds vote of the board for failure to attend meetings.

- (d) The members of the board shall serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for the reasonable and necessary expenses actually incurred in the performance of their duties, provided, however, such expenses shall be limited to such amounts as may be appropriated by the city council.
- **Section 2.** Should any phrase, clause, sentence or section of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not effect the remaining provisions of this ordinance, which provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council are authorized pursuant to state law to offer and provide parks, open spaces and recreation services for the residents of the City of Grantville; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council desire to provide a means for citizen input into the recreation; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Council have determined that the appropriate means of accomplishing that purpose is to establish a Parks and Recreation Advisory Board for the City of Grantville composed of five members,

NOW THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia as follows:

- Section 1. That the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grantville is hereby amended by striking Section 2-162(a) in its entirety and replacing it as follows:
- (a) Number and Appointment. The Grantville Parks and Recreation Advisory Board shall be composed of five (5) members appointed by the mayor and city council. All members shall be either a resident, property owner or business owner within the city limits of the City of Grantville, or a resident of Coweta County. Members shall be persons who have expressed a readiness to devote time and effort to learning about recreation and cultural art; a willingness to become knowledgeable in the areas of parks and open green spaces that include standards, trends, and new developments and an initiative and ability to plan creatively. In addition, members shall have an open mind, intellectual curiosity, and respect for the opinions of others, and a willingness to improve the City's Park and Recreational services on all levels.
- Section 2. Should any phrase, clause, sentence or section of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not effect the remaining provisions of this ordinance, which provisions shall remain in full force and effect.
- Section 3. All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

ORDINANCE NO. 2025-16

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF GRANTVILLE, GEORGIA, TO AMEND CHAPTER 26 OF THE CODE OF THE CITY TO CREATE ARTICLE VIII- MISCELANEOUS NUISCANCES; TO CREATE A SECTION 26-175- ENGINE RETARDING BRAKE OR COMPRESSION BRAKING; TO PROHIBIT THE USE OF ENGINE BRAKES WITHOUT EMERGENCY OR NECESSITY; TO PROVIDE FOR SERVERABILITY; TO PROVIDE FOR PENALTIES.

WHEREAS, excessive and disturbing sound is a serious hazard to the public health and welfare, safety and quality of life; and

WHEREAS, the City of Grantville finds that the unregulated use of engine brake devices in the City jeopardizes the continued peaceable and quiet nature of the City, and the use of such devices without justification creates excessive noise harmful and otherwise detrimental to individuals and to the community on the enjoyment of life and in the conduct of business; and

WHEREAS, the City of Grantville is authorized to regulate the operation of motor vehicles; to define a nuisance and provide for its abatement; and to provide for the general health, safety, and welfare by definition, regulation, and prohibition of any act, practice, conduct, or use of property detrimental to the health, welfare, and safety of the City's inhabitants.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT AND IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Mayor and Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia and by the authority thereof:

Section 1. That Chapter 26, Nuisances, of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grantville, Georgia, as amended, is hereby further amended to include Chapter 26, Article VIII, Sec. 26-175.

ARTICLE VIII. MISCELLANEOUS NUISANCES

Sec. 26-175 - Engine Retarding Brake or Compression Braking

The purpose of this section is to prohibit the excessive, loud, unusual or explosive use of engine and compressed air-braking devices within the City of Grantville with the exception of emergency vehicles.

(a) It shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle to use or operate or cause to be used or operated within the City, any engine brake, compression brake or mechanical exhaust device designed to aid in the braking or deceleration of any vehicle unless

such use is necessary to avoid imminent danger. This refers to any engine retarding brake system, transmission brake, or any other retarding brake system that alters normal compression, including but not limited to DYNAMIC BRAKE, JACOBS BRAKE, C-BRAKE, PACCAR BRAKE, or any other make or model of engine braking system, or other braking system that alters the normal compression of the engine and subsequently releases that compression.

- (b) Areas of prohibition. The prohibition set forth herein shall apply to all public streets and highways in the City of Grantville.
- (c) Signage. Signs prohibiting "engine retarding brakes" may be installed at locations deemed appropriate by the City Council or Chief of Police to advise motorists of the prohibitions contained in this section. Except that, no sign prohibiting "engine retarding brakes" shall be installed on a state highway without the approval from the Georgia Department of Transportation. The provisions of this section shall be in full force and effect upon passage by the city council.
- (d) Penalties. Any person, firm or corporation violating the provisions of this section, shall upon a violation of this section shall be punishable as set forth in Section 3.06(d)(3).

Section 2. Should any phrase, clause, sentence or section of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such determination shall not effect the remaining provision of this ordinance, which provision shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 3. All ordinances or resolutions, or parts thereof, which conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

WHEREAS, an Intergovernmental Agreement was made and entered into as of July 20, 2017 by Coweta County and the City of Grantville; and

WHEREAS, Coweta County is authorized to levy and collect a one percent Special Purpose Local Option Sales Tax (SPLOST) for the funding of capital outlay projects (Projects); and

WHEREAS, Coweta County and the City of Grantville have negotiated a division of the SPLOST proceeds as authorized by the Sales and Use Tax Act; and

WHEREAS, Coweta County and the City of Grantville entered into the Intergovernmental Agreement to identify the Projects that would be funded with SPLOST; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Intergovernmental Agreement, the City of Grantville has the sole right to determine how much they will spend on City Projects and fund the City Projects in any order or priority it deems necessary or convenient.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Grantville, Georgia, and it is hereby resolved as follows:

That all 2019-2024 SPLOST funds not expended and consumed on specific Capital Improvement Projects are consolidated for utilization on any or all remaining Capital Improvement Program projects.
