PUBLIC NOTIFICATION IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER TTHM VIOLATIONS AT Grantville Water System

Our community water system recently violated a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as our customers, you have the right to know what happened, what you should do, and what we are doing to correct this situation. We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants. We have been notified by the State that our water system exceeded the maximum contaminant levels (MCL) for the following:

What should / do?

- There is nothing you need to do. You do not need to boil your water or take other corrective actions.
 However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.
- If you have a severely compromised immune system, have an infant, are pregnant, or are elderly, you may
 be at increased risk and should seek advice from your health care providers about drinking this water.

What does this mean?

Some people who drink water containing Trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years, may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. If you have a severely compromised immune system, have an infant, are pregnant, or are elderly, you may be at increased risk and should seek advice from your health care providers about drinking this water.

What happened? What is being done? The City of Grantville has implemented a rotating hydrant flushing schedule and is decreasing the amount of chlorine used to disinfect. Along with these items, the City is working with Coweta County to see that they reduce the TTHM levels as they enter our water. We hope to have the rolling average TTHM lowered in the next year.
